# Roger's Greeting "Back to the Future" Written on Wednesday, July 15, 2020



In this month's "paper" newsletter, I shared how a friend and colleague sent me an old paper I had written in the last month of my seminary education in 1985. It was written in May of 1985 and entitled, "Toward A New Spiritual Center". The visiting professor was the Dr. Rev. Paul Nagano (Shelley Nagata's granduncle).

While 1985 was a different time, many of the issues prevalent are not too far off from today. In this paper, I set forth what I believed and hoped would be a spiritual shift in the years ahead.

Reflecting on this paper, some of the issues have changed, some have shifted or have come to the forefront. Clearly, much of what I had hoped for has not been achieved.

As I reflect on my mindset of 1985 and the current radical shift in race issues, I have a better understanding of why I have been sparked by the social upheaval that is occurring as our nation, in a raw but real way, as we deal with our history of racism.

In these past several weeks, I have seen shifts that I had no longer believed I would see in my ministerial career. While these times are filled with rest and anxiety, perhaps we are witnessing and living through a major shift of paradigms.

Perhaps, at least a part of our selves can step away from our fear and anxiety so we could be grateful that we are those "privileged beings who are present and share in such events."

#### From Brad Shirakawa:

The best doc/film I've yet seen about the 442nd comes from Japan and the NHK in 2016. It's an excellent composite of re-creating the 442 with modern-day actors and pretty darn good special effects, plus historic info/footage.

Nowhere will you real footage from the war on the 442nd dealing with the German artillery (88s) blasting them in the Vosges mountains in France, but the NHK does a good job with modern video and actors.

When 90+ year-old veteran Lawson Sakai (photo) talks about the tree bursts, it's hard to imagine...so the NHK does a good job of blowing up trees and re-creating the deadly wood shards of shrapnel that killed and injured many of the Nisei. Bullets flying, machine guns... you can read about that stuff, but I've never seen it quite like this. It's somewhat comparable to what Steven Spielberg did in Saving Private Ryan.

Interestingly, the NHK differs (as I do in my 442 documents) about the number of Nisei casualties during the Rescue of the Lost Battalion. You will find the casualty number listed at 800 in every blog, website, book, movie, doc, brochure... but the NHK says it's 350 over the 5 days of the rescue, not 800... They include casualties from the 2nd battalion at Hill 617...which was a kilometer east of the actual site where the 200+ Texans were trapped.

I've seen other modern-day info that the number is around 400 ( Casualties are the wounded, the dead, the sick, the injured, missing in action, etc)

Other 442 researchers (notably Peter Wakamatsu of the 442.org) say it's less than that. Wakamatsu also maintains that the Rescue took 3 days, not 5, and that the 2nd Battalion was not part of the Rescue. (I differ with him on that last point).

Regardless of the number of casualties, the NHK doc is worth seeing, especially if you haven't paid much attention to the 442nd. Prepare to be riveted.

Blue shop towel simple disposable mask, no sew, a few minutes to make. I agree, it is rather 'comfortable' to wear. Even better if, instead of rubber bands, you use hair ties or pieces cut from socks, trouser socks, panty hose. Also, can substitute pipe cleaners, twist ties, plant tape, etc. for paper clip shown for nose piece. Links to short and long tutorials:

The best choices for DIY masks are cotton t-shirts, pillowcases, or other cotton materials. These materials filter out approximately 50% of 0.2-micron particles, similar in size to the coronavirus. They are also as easy to breathe through.

Doubling the layers of material for the DIY mask gives a very small increase in filtration effectiveness, but makes it much more difficult to breathe through.
